Special thanks to Debbie Anderson, Adleyn Scott, Hunter Mullen, and Doyle Register for leading the summer choir this year and to Michelle Folta, Nathan Smock, and Adleyn Scott for leading music in 2023 - including Easter! - while Rick was undergoing chemo. Michelle, Nathan, Debbie, and Adleyn all stepped in many times over the past year when Rick needed to be away, and they gathered many friends to offer excellent music for Rick's funeral. Their commitment and dedication ensured that the tradition of glorious music at St. Thomas would continue.

We will begin a search soon for the next leader (or leaders) to direct St. Thomas Music into a new chapter. For now, though, we need to pause and pray, tend to our grief, and begin to envision what the next decades of St. Thomas Music will be like. What music will we offer in our remodeled space to lift our hearts and inspire our worship? What music do the people of St. Thomas hope to make and experience together? 



Our renovation is happening quickly! Most work to date involved building a stunning backdrop to frame our altar and make space for the choir. Next steps: finishes, flooring, ramps, and parking spaces.

Finance Update (as of 8/5/24)

Total cost of the project \$4,128,777

Total costs paid to date \$908,988

Remaining costs \$3,219,789

Almost half of our support for this project comes from **141 pledges** from members & friends of St. Thomas. Thank you!

Pledge Update (as of 8/5/24)

Total amount pledged \$1,870,430
Pledges paid to date \$653,579
Remaining pledges \$1,216,851

In addition, several special gifts made this vision possible.

- A generous gift from Clifford & Bobsie Swift launched our strategic planning process and initial design work.
- A beguest from Joe Fischer put the vision within reach.
- A grant from the Walter Alan Richards Foundation (Celia Page's grandfather) got us closer to the goal.
- Judy Harding named St. Thomas as beneficiary of a fund with the Community Foundation of the Chattahoochee Valley, to be used at the discretion of the vestry. After her death, our vestry invested this gift in short-term instruments to pay construction bills and avoid bank financing. A portion of Judy's gift will be used to complete the project. The rest will fund an endowment in Judy's memory to support St. Thomas forever.
- These gifts totaled \$2.25 million, a little over half of total costs.

Shine Time Sunday School & Wednesday Nights






The EpiscoKid Adventurers





In this classic by C. S. Lewis, a demon, named Screwtape, writes letters to his nephew Wormwood about how to lure a new Christian away from God. This imaginative and clever story reveals how easy it is for people to turn aside from the path of love and follow a path of destruction. Interestingly, C. S. Lewis wrote this book during World War II, a time of great anxiety and division, which Screwtape and his companions sought to use to their advantage in the story. This book from long ago has a message for our time. Journey Groups will discuss a different letter each week and consider how we might stay faithful in the midst of the anxieties and struggles of our day. You don't have to read the book to take part in the discussion, but you'll get more out of it if you do. Used copies of the book will be available to purchase for \$7, or feel free to borrow a copy and return it at the end of the sessions.

Manna & Mercy: The Hebrew Scriptures

Back again for those who have not yet taken part and for those who want to review it again, Manna & Mercy is a delightful summary of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation (with pictures!). It presents the Bible as one whole story of God's mission to heal our broken world. Video messages from South African pastor Alan Storey accompany the study. One Manna & Mercy group will meet on Wednesday nights, with more groups if needed. This is a foundational learning experience at St. Thomas and we hope everyone will participate at some point.






Sleep in Heavenly Peace Bed Build: September 14
