
St. Thomas Annual Meeting





A Journey with Greater Beallwood Baptist Church

Thurman was a significant 20th Century theologian who is often called the spiritual godfather of the Civil Rights Movement. His work and witness inspired Dr. King and many others. Rev. Adrian Chester, Pastor of Greater Beallwood, and Rev. Grace will co-lead a study using Howard Thurman's brief book *Deep River: The Negro Spiritual Speaks of Life and Death.* You don't have to read the book in order to participate, but feel free to order a copy if you wish. Sessions will take place at St. Thomas on January 11, 25, and February 8. Sessions will take place at Greater Beallwood on January 18, February 1, and February 15. Dinner will be


available at either church. On the nights we are at Greater Beallwood, children will remain in programming at St. Thomas and will be supervised until parents return from Greater Beallwood.

face or by Zoom. Our next Journey Groups will meet during Lent and Easter (except Holy Week) to explore the content of the Nicene Creed which we use most Sundays in our worship. What was it originally trying to communicate, and how can it best be used and understood today? What difference does it make? Sign-ups begin in early February, with different groups meeting on Wednesday evenings, late Sunday afternoons, or early Tuesday afternoons; select whatever time works best for you. Our study resource this round is the book, *Loving the Questions: An Exploration of the Nicene Creed*, by the late Dr. Marianne H. Micks, professor of biblical and historical theology at Virginia Theological Seminary until her retirement in 1988.




