#### **PENTECOST**

On the Day of Pentecost, as described in Acts 2, the Holy Spirit fell with power on the believers. People who spoke different languages were able to understand one another. Peter explained that this was the intentional work of God's Spirit, not a drunken spectacle. Three thousand people were baptized on that day, and the life of the Church began.

While we are grateful for our life together as St. Thomas, we recognize that we are part of something much bigger than our one congregation. We belong to a global family of Christian people who seek to follow in the way of Jesus and make this world more like God's reign in heaven.

In this season, we will have several opportunities to learn about parts of that wider family. The General Convention of the Episcopal Church meets in June. Our youth and young adults plan to attend part of the gathering. On Sundays in June during adult formation time, we will talk about how General Convention is organized, the election of a new Presiding Bishop, and issues that are likely to come up. Also this summer, we'll share in a Summer of Service, working with people of many faith traditions in our community. Guest speakers on Sundays in July will talk about local and diocesan ministries. And some of our choir members are traveling this summer with Voices of the Valley to Italy where, among other events, they will sing at the Vatican and encounter some of the Christian history of the region.

In the Nicene Creed, we say that we believe in "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church." That means that we understand that all of the Christian expressions around the world are ONE. The Church is HOLY because we share in God's holy and redemptive work. CATHOLIC means universal - present all over the world. We all descend from the witness of the APOSTLES.

Join us as we celebrate the wider work of the Church and the privilege of being part of it.







# Making Room for All: Construction Updates

We've enjoyed a great start to the construction process. The transition from the Nave to All Saints Hall for worship went very smoothly. Demolition in the nave was completed ahead of schedule. Now the slow work begins!

Over the summer, we expect to see the following changes:

- The reredos wall behind the altar will start to be framed in May. This is a complex project and will take about six weeks to complete.
- At the same time, work will also begin to frame in the new back wall and add backer board. Half-bricks will be installed over this board later in July.
- Work on the new parking spaces begins in June and is expected to take ten weeks.
- HVAC and electric rough-ins begin in late June or early July.
- Raising the floor and cabinetry work begin in August.

A reminder that the nave space and hallways around it are a construction zone. Hard hats and steel toed shoes are required for entrance. Please do not enter without permission from the contractor. It is occasionally safe to observe from the choir loft, but always check before entering.


#### **2024-2025 School Year**

**Environmental justice can't wait!** All of this is a matter of justice, bringing results to lowincome communities and communities of color that have been historically overburdened by pollution.


