





#### **CROSSING THE THRESHOLD**

Our theme at St. Thomas for the next few months is *Crossing the Threshold*.

We do NOT mean the old and disturbing custom of carrying a bride across a doorway after a wedding! Some sources say that custom originated in Roman times and implied that a woman was being carried to a new life against her will.

We have in mind something closer to a stage in the Hero's Journey, as identified long ago by Joseph Campbell. In looking at many religious traditions and ancient texts, Campbell noticed a pattern. At some point in these stories, heroes often faced a decision - whether to continue with life as they had always known it, or step into the unknown and all the possibilities that might lie ahead. Crossing the Threshold is a stage in the hero's journey.

Campbell aside, there are many examples in the Bible. The people of Israel crossed the Red Sea to enter the Wilderness. They crossed the Jordan to enter the Promised Land. Jesus submitted to baptism and crossed the threshold of temptation before beginning his ministry. Later, he turned his face to Jerusalem. He crossed from death into life and invites us to follow where he led the way.

St. Thomas will be crossing many thresholds over the next few months. We are getting closer to crossing a physical threshold and returning to worship in our remodeled and accessible nave, hopefully in Advent. This physical threshold is a sign of a spiritual journey. Many doors are opening for St. Thomas and we are invited to cross together into new ways of welcome and witness.

Thank you for being part of our heroic journey together with God!

"It is a Christian obligation to vote, and more than that, it is the church's responsibility to help get souls to the polls." Presiding Bishop Michael Curry An election season marks the crossing of a threshold as we choose leaders to serve us in the years ahead. The Episcopal Church invites all Episcopalians to Vote Faithfully in this election season and encourage our neighbors to do the same. Here are several reminders:

- Early voting begins October 15 in Georgia. Absentee ballots can be requested in Alabama at www.sos.alabama.gov.
- Remind your friends and neighbors to vote.
- Before going to the polls, pray for all candidates and give thanks for their willingness to serve.
- Review a sample ballot before you vote and be prepared to vote in local and state elections as well as national elections. Georgia sample ballots: georgia.gov/view-sample-ballot . Alabama sample ballots: www.sos.alabama.gov/alabama-votes/2024-general-election-sample-ballots
- We invite you to use the St. Thomas labyrinth as an aid to prayer in this season. Prayers for an election season will be in the box located by the labyrinth. Each bench at the labyrinth will include a reminder to pray for various elected leaders and situations in our world.
- As you pray for our elected leaders, consider whether you need to contact them about an issue to allow your voice to be heard. www.usa.gov/elected-officials can help you find their info.

## Remembering the Faithful Departed

All Saints Day is more than a day.

It is three days to give thanks and remember those who have crossed the threshold from this life to the life to come whose faith still inspires us today.

All Saints Eve (aka Halloween, October 31) acknowledges the reality of death and reminds us that we have nothing to fear because nothing separates us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

That's why we have fun on this day.

**All Saints Day** (November 1) focuses on saints remembered by the whole Church who were clear examples of the life of Christ in their day. We give thanks for their witness and pray to be like them.

**The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed** (aka All Souls Day, November 2) honors the entire communion of saints, those known by many or known only to us. It celebrates their eternal life with God from which they pray for us and share in God's mission of love in the world.

**All Saints Sunday** (the first Sunday after All Saints, November 3 this year) often gathers all of these purposes into one day, hopefully without losing the importance of each observance.

Join us for these events celebrating all the Saints!




### Trunk or Treat Our All Saints Eve Celebration!

#### Sunday, November 3, All Saints Sunday



#### **Contemplative Service**


October 27, November 17 (third Sunday), & December 22. 5 pm, in the Chapel From The Rev. Roxane Gwyn - The framework scripture for our sacred time together each month is this: More than ever the word about Jesus spread far and wide. Crowds were gathering to hear him and to be cured of their diseases. Meanwhile, Jesus would slip away to deserted places and pray. Luke 5:15-16

Upon Jesus' example we base our Contemplative/Healing service. We gather in candlelight and silence, the Spirit's presence welcoming and powerful. The cantor chants gentle Taizé music, as all are invited to listen or to join. We share scripture and a meditation of healing and love, then prayers and more prayers.

Silence threads herself in and out, providing abundant time for communion with God. Christ invites us forward twice, once for healing prayers and anointing, and again for Holy Communion with homemade bread. We depart as the Spirit leads us out in silence, with poetry and scripture to carry us home for the evening.

**DECEMBER's** excursion will be back at RiverCenter for "Christmas with C.S. Lewis." Saturday, December 7, time to be decided.





We are nearing completion of the renovation of the nave. The work began on April 7. If all goes well, the contractors plan to complete their work before the end of November. Then the pews will be recovered, the sound and livestream equipment installed, new choir chairs delivered, and the organ re-installed with pipes in the loft as they were before and upgraded digital components and console in the front. We are getting close!



#### **All Saints Sunday Episcokid Saint Procession**




#### **Sunday Adult Formation: Creation Care**

The Creation Keepers, St. Thomas' Green Team who seek to care for our shared home will present an Adult Formation series on Creation Care. The topics will include:


- Developing the Indigenous Mindset
- Overview of the Creation Care/Environmental Stewardship Resolutions from General Convention
- Discussion on Clean Energy and Carbon Sinks (keeping carbon out of the air; keeping carbon in the ground)
- Achieving net zero goals through individual and collective action to sustain Earth's beauty and resources

The triple planetary crisis urgently demands our prayerful attention and response: Climate change, Loss of biodiversity, and Pollution. Each of these problems is a crisis of its own, but all three converge and exacerbate each other. Destabilizing, dismantling, and polluting Earth's life-systems is an issue of social and racial injustice. Historically marginalized and underserved communities are hurt first and worst by the effects of a degraded environment and are those least likely to have a seat at the table where policy decisions are made. Leaving a ruined world to our children and children's children is likewise an issue of intergenerational injustice. As people of faith, we understand that environmental degradation is a deeply spiritual and moral issue and that the Church is called to proclaim through prayer and action God's good news to the whole Creation.

Tuesday, October 1st! Buddy Packs are small packets of food that go home on Fridays with students that have been identified as living in food insecure homes. We are able to provide 80 students with extra food on the weekends every week, thanks to to your generosity! We will continue to provide Buddy Packs throughout the school year, delivering them once a month on the first Tuesday of every month from 9:00 am to 10:00 am.


If you want to do something that makes a big difference in the life of a child, but don't have a lot of free time, this is an excellent opportunity for you. There are two ways you can participate:

1.) We pick up the Buddy Packs from Feeding the Valley at 9 am. If you are able to lift heavy boxes, we will load 32 boxes into our vehicles and then transport them to Brewer. Once at the school, we will take the boxes into the school on dollies and you can be on your way by 9:30.

2.) Another group of volunteers meets at the school at 9:30. These volunteers unpack them into plastic storage containers. The school places them in student backpacks on Friday afternoons. We are usually finished by 10 am. This is happening once a month on the first Tuesday of every month throughout the school year. Upcoming deliveries will take place on Tuesday, November 5th, and Tuesday, December 3rd. Please let me me know if you are interested in helping out!

As the holidays approach, we'll be offering a chance to make donations to our Buddy Pack program as gifts in honor of loved ones. Please be on the lookout for more about this in the coming months! 
learning so much. Please come watch us if you can. Games times are listed in the Celebrations & Sorrows emails each Friday.
